

LET THEM KNOW YOU MOVED

Make sure the most important people and information will find you in your new home. Don't forget to make arrangements to discontinue any uneeded services (e.g. electric, gas, water, internet, telephone, cable, etc.) on moving day to avoid additional charges.

Family & Friends Many of your close family members and friends may be helping you with your move. For the others, consider making a list and using social media or mailing a note with your new address.
Postal Service After family and friends, arguably one of the most important places to advise of your move is the USPS. To forward your mail on a specified date, simply fill out a Change of Address Form here or at your local post office.
Physicians & Other Healthcare Providers Make sure to update your new contact information for your primary care physician, dentist and any specialists you regularly see.
Family Attorney Make sure to update your family attorney with your new contact information.
Bank & Financial Institutions Don't forget to provide your bank and all your credits card companies with your new address.
Utilities Don't forget to have service disconnected on or just after moving day for electricity, gas, water, telephone, cable, internet, trash removal and other municipal services.
Insurance Companies Changes in your current residence can affect your homeowners policy and your life and health insurance agencies should also have your current address on file.
The IRS To ensure you recieve your tax return, fiscal notes and other documents, print out and mail in the IRS <u>Change of Address form here.</u>
Passport, Driver's License or ID Cards Don't forget to update these important documents if applicable.
Subscription Services & Clubs This includes magazines, newspapers and any other regular deliveries.
